




Sorghum Assurances Protocol

The Sorghum Assurances Protocol compiles and details the regulations, processes and best practices that are conducive to sustainable sorghum production in the U.S.

It was developed to support global stakeholders in documenting the assurances of U.S. sorghum production.

It defines 'Sustainable Sorghum Volumes' and enables their integration into the Council's web-based platform. This allows the issuance of 'Records of Assurance' for international sorghum transactions.
